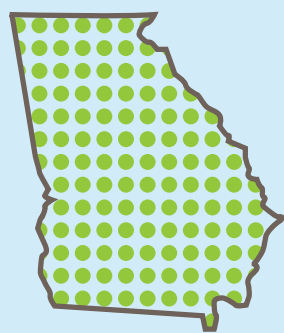


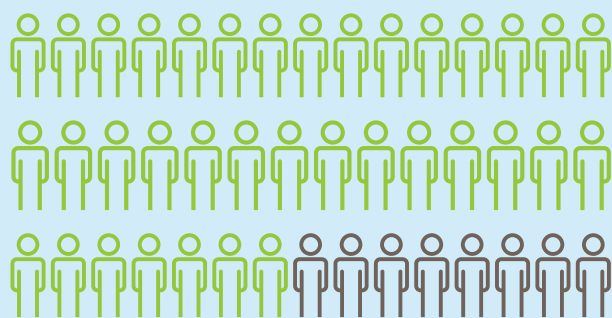
Why Does Georgia Need Georgia Memory Net?

Of Those, 310K Have Not Been Evaluated or Treated



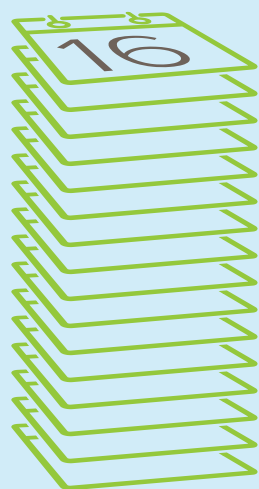
Predicted Increase in Patients With Alzheimer's in Georgia by 2025:

STEP 1:

- Billable by your practice
- Easy to code & bill:
 - G0438—initial AWW visit; G0439—subsequent AWW visit
- Embedded MiniCog™ screening to detect cognitive impairment takes 3 minutes
- MiniCog™ score less than 3 suggests patient appropriate for Memory Assessment Clinic referral

Patients under 65 can also be referred if cognitive impairment has been detected through other observations.

STEP 3:

Patients referred to a Georgia Memory Net Memory Assessment Clinic return to their PCP's care with their personalized care plan and are connected to community resources.

STEP 2:

GMN's Memory Assessment Clinics support your practice with fast Alzheimer's diagnoses.

- A streamlined 2 visit process:
 - VISIT 1: Formal diagnosis by expert-trained clinicians
 - VISIT 2: Community Services Educator advises patient and care partners
- Patients connect with community resources
- Patient and PCP receive personalized care plan
